



A Word From Pastor Jack...

#### RAISE CHRIST MORE

John the Baptist was chosen by God for an important ministry. He came in the spirit of Elijah, preaching prophetic words, preparing human hearts for the arrival of the Kingdom of God. John called all people, rich, poor, powerful, and weak to repent of their sin. Many wandered down to the banks of the Jordan River to hear John preach. Some were plunged beneath the waters of baptism. John became a celebrity of sorts, even capturing the attention of the Herods in the elite class. One day, while baptizing repentant individuals in the river, Jesus showed up. That was the beginning of the end for John. You see, John recognized Jesus right away. Jesus was the King for whom John was preparing the way. Although John the Baptist had a following and disciples of his own, he said of Jesus, "This is the one I meant when I said, 'A man who comes after me has surpassed me because he was before me.' I myself did not know him, but the reason I came baptizing with water was that he might be revealed to Israel." (John 1:30-31) John also said, "I have seen and I testify that this is God's Chosen One." (John 1:34)



Some time later, troublemakers attempted to stir up resentment between John and Jesus. They came to John and said, "Rabbi, that man who was with you on the other side of the Jordan—the one you testified about—look, he is baptizing, and everyone is going to him." (John 3:26) If John did not have a grip on his own identity, he may have felt threatened or became envious. Instead, John said, "I am not the Messiah but am sent ahead of him... He must become greater; I must become less." (John 3:30)

There is much we can learn from the humility of John the Baptist, but perhaps the most important lesson is to regard ourselves in proper perspective. In these days of selfies, personal branding, and social media, it is good to keep priorities in order. Our goal should always be to make a big deal of Jesus. If this means we fade into the shadows, or don't get the recognition we feel we deserve – so be it. If we are called to suffer indignity so that Christ's name might be proclaimed – so be it. Come what may, I pray this will be a year to promote Jesus. **Raise Christ More in 2024**.
