# A Word From Pastor Jack...

## A STAR WILL COME

Mention the name, Balaam, to Bible trivia specialists and they will remember him as a wicked prophet with a talking donkey. Somewhere in between the time his donkey chastised him, and he enticed the people of Israel into idolatry – Balaam spoke for the Lord. Balaam, who was from Moab, was hired by his king to speak curses against Israel. Instead of curses, Balaam, led by the Lord God of Israel, could do nothing but speak blessings. One of the blessings Balaam spoke under the inspiration of the Lord, was...



"I see him, but not now; behold him, but not near.

A star will come out of Jacob; a scepter will rise out of Israel." -Numbers 24:17

Balaam predicts a conquering king to rise from Israel. He says this king will come "not now" and "not near" but at a future time. The context indicates this as an end-times prophecy. This future king of Israel is called "a star" describing his glory and "a scepter" denoting his authority.

If this prophecy was spoken in isolation, it might predict any of the future kings of Israel. But it's not an isolated prophecy. In the book of Genesis, Jacob blesses his sons. He says of Judah,

"The scepter will not depart from Judah, nor the ruler's staff from between his feet, until he to whom it belongs shall come and the obedience of the nations shall be his." – Genesis 49:10

It's hard not to compare Jacob's prophecy with Balaam's prophecy. They both speak of a future conquering ruler. They both figuratively mention his scepter.

After the birth of Jesus, magi came from the East looking for the King of the Jews. What was it that led them to Jerusalem and ultimately to the home of Joseph, Mary, and Jesus? Matthew tells us...

After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him."
-Matthew 2:1-2

They came looking for the Messiah because of a star. They met Jesus and were convinced, as they departed, that they had seen the true star. While Jesus never held the scepter of Israel during his first advent, Scripture promises he will one day wield the scepter of Israel and the entire earth.

When we worship Jesus at Christmastime and every day, we worship the true star of Bethlehem. We worship the King of kings and Lord of lords before whom every knee shall bow. I pray you will bow your life to him now, willingly. The newborn King. Our Savior and Lord. Merry Christmas to you and yours.

You will not find the word Noel anywhere in Scripture, but we sing it at Christmastime each year. It simply means "Christmas." It is from an old French word believed to be derived from the Latin word for the Nativity, or the birth of Christ. Although this word has no biblical origin, the concept certainly does. Luke 2:7 says, "Then she [Mary] gave birth to her firstborn son, and she wrapped him tightly in cloth and laid him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them" (CSB). This newborn King was what prophets had been waiting for and what many rulers had feared. Though the chorus of "The First Noel" uses the phrase "Born is the King of Israel," we know that Jesus-Born to Mary, wrapped in rags, and laid in a manger-became the King of kings and Lord of lords when He later sacrificed Himself so that we could live with Him forever in heaven. 
